A recent article in the journal, *Science*, concludes that those who give to others are happier than those who don't. Researchers at the University of British Columbia and Harvard University were "struck by how big the effect on happiness was and that how people spent money was more important to one's happiness than how much money they had." As one scientist put it, "higher pro-social spending was associated with significantly greater happiness." Three different studies conducted by the team all produced the same pronounced results.

AAWGT members should be very happy, given that our \$550 contribution has been turned into \$100,000 in grant money to support women and families in AAC! Remember, our theme for this year is "be a member, bring a member" and our goal was to retain our 100 members and add 100. If you have not yet paid your 2008 dues, please send them so you can participate in the election in December. If you have paid, be sure to bring a new member to the October 15th meeting to hear how our grants have helped women in our community.

At our November 12th meeting, the nominating committee will be presenting the slate of officers for 2009. Board members and staff from seven of AAWGT's 10 grantees attended. The training was held August 20th at the Glen Burnie Town Center campus of Anne Arundel Community College.


All participants agreed on the value of the informal networking where new partnerships were forged. They thanked the Foundation and the AAWGT for facilitating the training and networking opportunity and indicated their interest in attending future sessions.

Organizational Updates

Since our last meeting in June for the showcase, your Steering Committee has been busy doing the work of AAWGT. Here are some updates to keep you informed:

- **June Giving Circle Conference** -seven members of the steering committee attended a conference in Baltimore with area giving circles and came away with many new ideas to make our giving circle better
- **July Retreat** -the Steering Committee spent a whole day discussing our successes and challenges and planning for 2009
- **August Volunteer Day** -14 members worked with Partners In Care to put together 50 emergency boxes and deliver them to seniors
- **Membership Survey Analyzed** -the results of the membership survey sent out in May were used at the July retreat to plan for the future. 53 members responded; 92% said that their reason for joining AAWGT was to participate in philanthropy; 87% said they were very satisfied with our work; request for more outreach activities for members to participate in (like our volunteer day)
- **AAWGT in What's Up Magazine** -September issue on page 172
- **AAWGT T-Shirt** -we have T-Shirts with our logo on it for sale and the money will be used for membership
